#### BREAKFAST CLUB

Open daily from 8am. Booking through the office required via phone/ email and payment of £1.05 to the kitchen on a daily basis.

#### AFTER SCHOOL CLUB

After School Club operates daily from 2-5pm at a cost of £2 per hour, per child. Bookings are on a weekly basis by completing a form and sending payment in a sealed envelope. Activities include outdoor play, art & craft, construction & homework club.

#### DINNER

Dinners are cooked on site by Ray and her team and are a popular choice at lunch time. A school dinner costs £2.60 per day and is paid directly to kitchen staff on a daily basis. The dinner menu is communicated to parents through the weekly update.
