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#### YEAR 1

We took part in Forest School Activities on Monday 1st April in our school grounds. We looked for shades of green in our environment and used a colour matching card to sort them. We also made mud using compost and water which we then used to make mud pictures along with natural resources we

#### YEAR 7

After 6 weeks of love and tender care, we released salmon alevins into a local river to allow them to increase salmon stocks. We investigated the water quality of the river and we are pleased to report the water is clean. We also investigated water filtration and how oil spills are cleaned from water courses.



## YEAR 2

We have been developing our understanding of addition and subtraction to 20. We use dice to add two numbers together and to find out which number to subtract from the other. We love to take our learning outdoors. Here we are working together and thinking 'outside the box'.



#### VEADE

We took part in a national earthworm and soil survey. Each group chose their site which we measured before digging for worms. We also tested the soil for calcium carbonate. We left our site exactly the same way as we had found it.



### eSAFETY

In partnership with Killowen P.S. and Kylemore Nursery, a parents' information session was held in West Bann Development on Tuesday 2nd April on the important issue of eSafety. There was a large turnout of parents and guardians who heard from a leading expert from NSPCC. She advised parents on ways to keep their children safe online including visiting our local O2 shop and availing of the O2 Guru service which helps parents setup parental controls on their child's device.

### YEAR 3

Our topic is Houses and Homes. We have been investigating the different types of houses in our local environment. We went for a walk around our local area and recorded what we saw on an observation sheet. We took pictures using the iPad which we uploaded to the app Clips and added narration.



#### YEAR

We have been working very hard to develop our understanding of the nets of a range of 3D shapes. We have enjoyed using clixi to make cubes, cuboids, prisms and pyramids. We opened these shapes to view their nets which we then drew accurately into our books.
