

EXCITING LEARNING IN OUR CLASSROOMS

YEAR 1

We have been learning all about winter since we returned to school in November. We went on a winter walk and looked for signs of winter. We can spot deciduous and evergreen trees and we played in the snow (flour) during Play Based Learning. In January, we are going to learn about Inuit people and their way of life.



YEAR 2

We used acrylic paint to produce snowmen canvases and we also made 3D glitter decorations, a fingerprint Christmas card and a 'window' Christmas card. This was an extra special card because we were learning about the three Rs: Reduce, Reuse and Recycle. We recycled old Christmas cards to place in our window, we reused the leftover glitter from our decorations and we reduced the amount of waste that went into our bins. We hope you like them!



YEAR 3

We used our topic as a stimulus for our canvas art project. We used acrylic paint to create an owl portrait based on the story "The Owl Who Was Afraid Of The Dark". We also responded to music through dance as we listened to Bill Oddie narrate about night birds.



YEAR 4

We have been working hard on our topic 'Whatever the Weather'. We have enjoyed learning about different types of weather and weather symbols. We have focused on poetry and used shape and acrostic poems to describe the weather. In Numeracy we recorded the weather for two weeks and then collated the data on different charts.



YEAR 5

We had a very exciting day with our friends in Killowen P.S. investigating floating and sinking. Before we started to make our boat we designed its shape and then we made it using play dough. We put our boats in a basin of water and then we placed 1p coins in it one by one until our boat began to sink.



YEAR 6

We are combining the Christmas season with our Mathematics and Numeracy learning. We have been plotting co-ordinates to create Christmas themed pictures. We have learned a very important rule when plotting co-ordinates, "Across the corridor and up the stairs." As well as this we are able to draw and label our axis accurately.



YEAR 7

We have an important message for all our pupils and families over the winter: BE BRIGHT, BE SEEN! We have been educating our younger children on ways to be safe when out and about over Christmas. Always wear bright colours and wear a high visibility jacket if you have one. Use the footpath if there is one and stay away from the edge of the footpath.



SHARED EDUCATION


