Wide range of clubs and extra-curricular opportunities available.

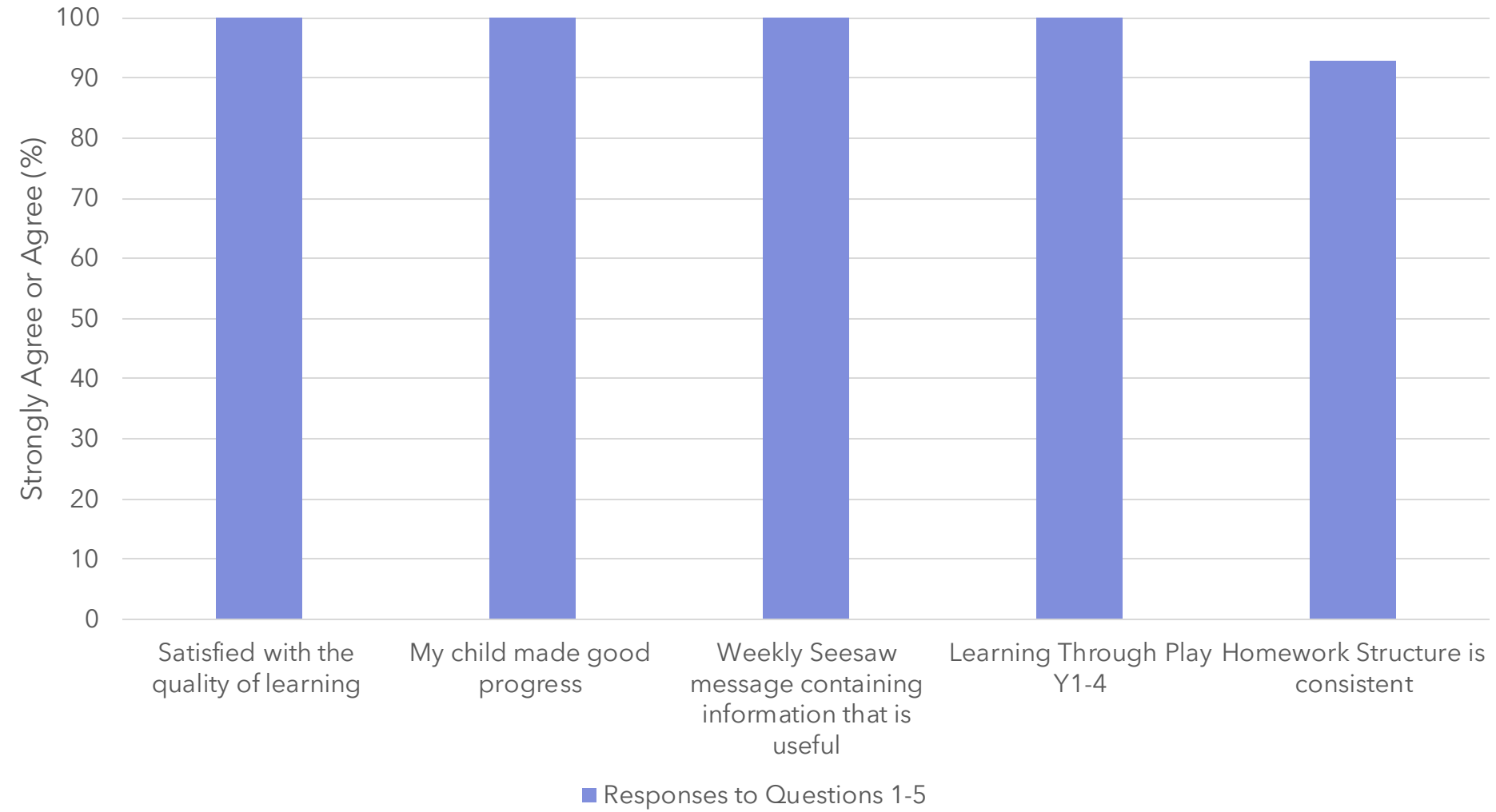
There is a good balance of work and fun at school.

I couldn't be happier to have my child at St. John's and would recommend the school to everyone.

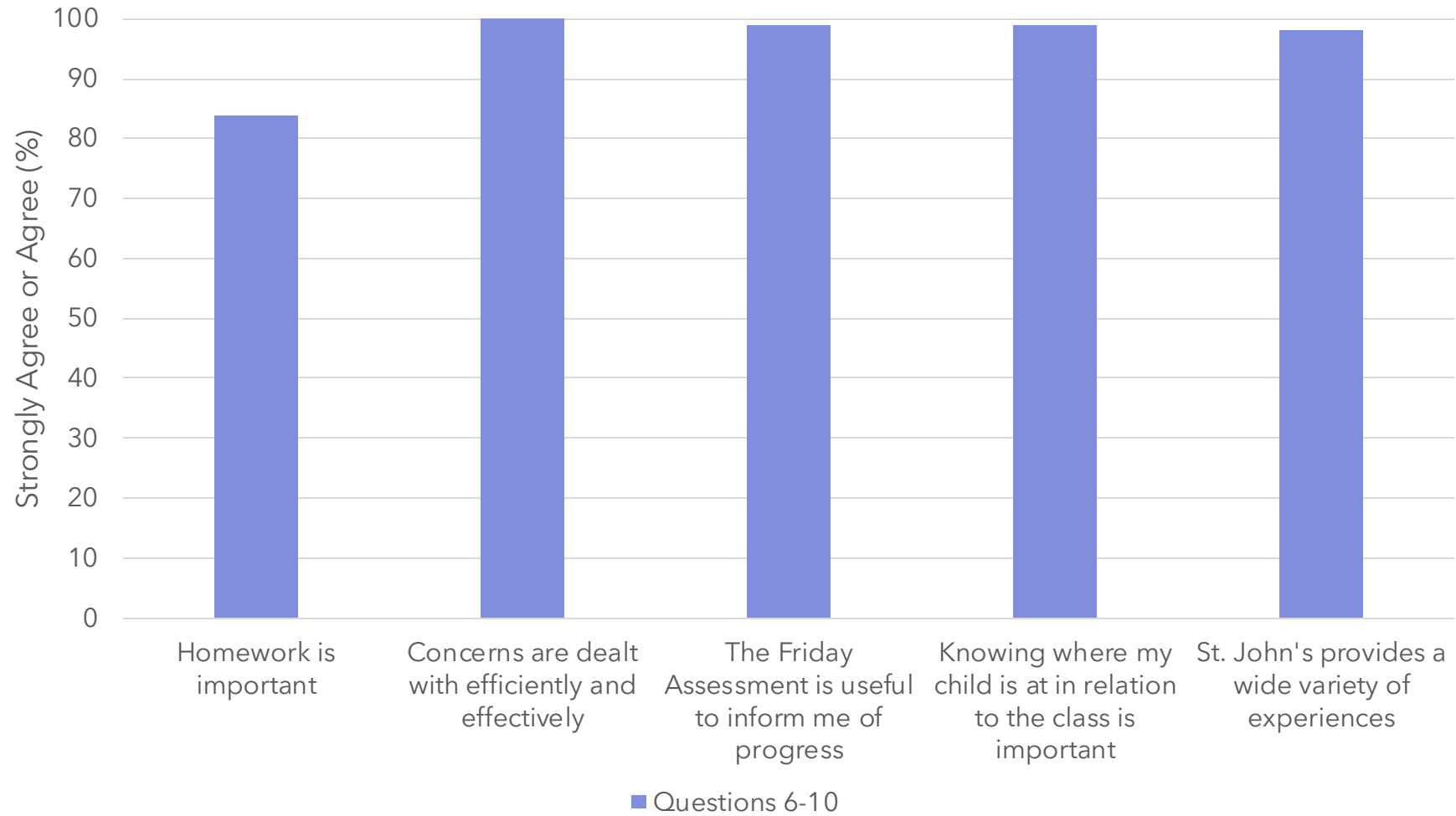
St. John's is a very attentive and helpful school, especially for children with SEN.

Wonderful music provision and opportunities in music and drama e.g. festivals and performances.

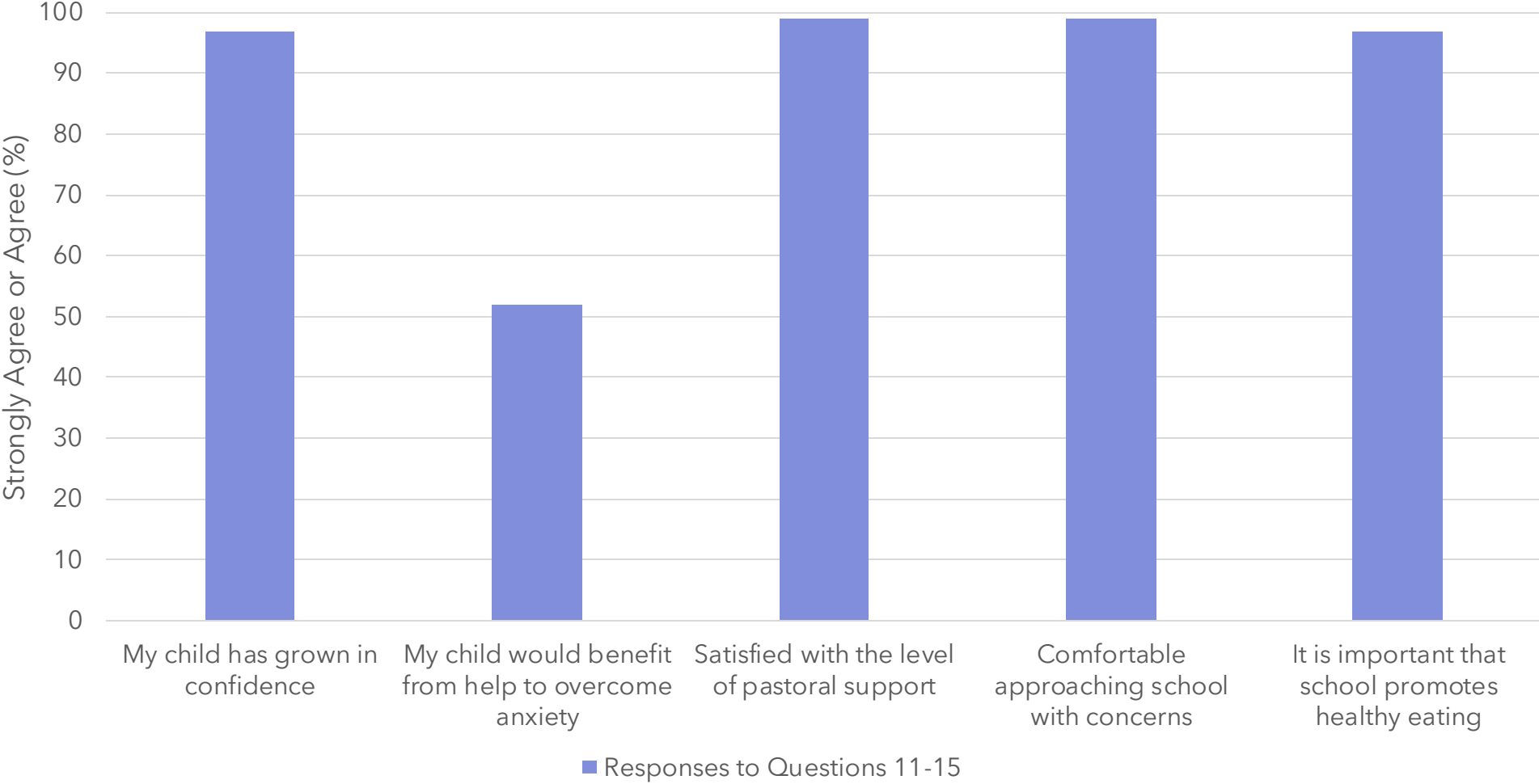
Responses to Questions 1-5



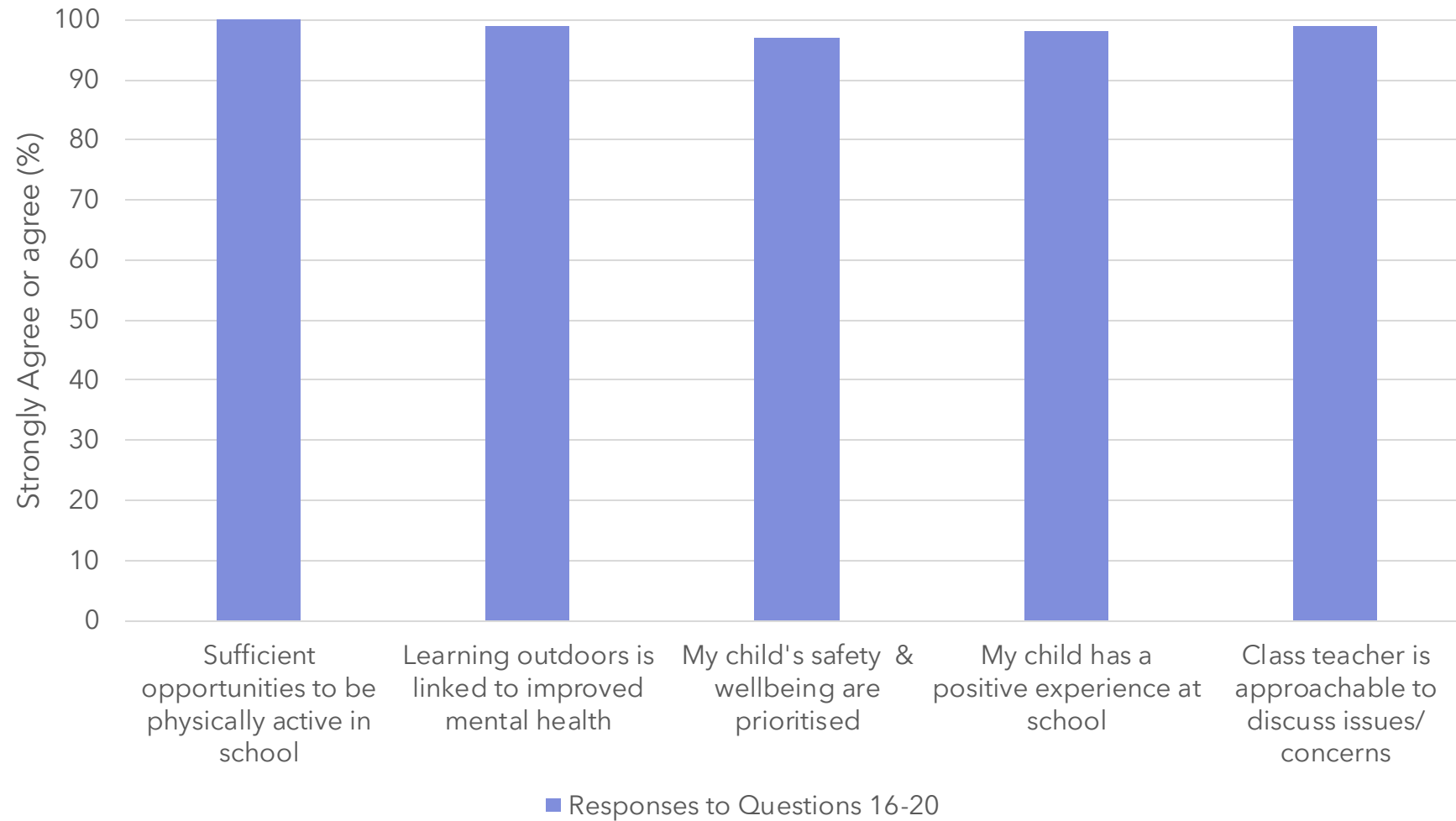
Responses to Questions 6-10



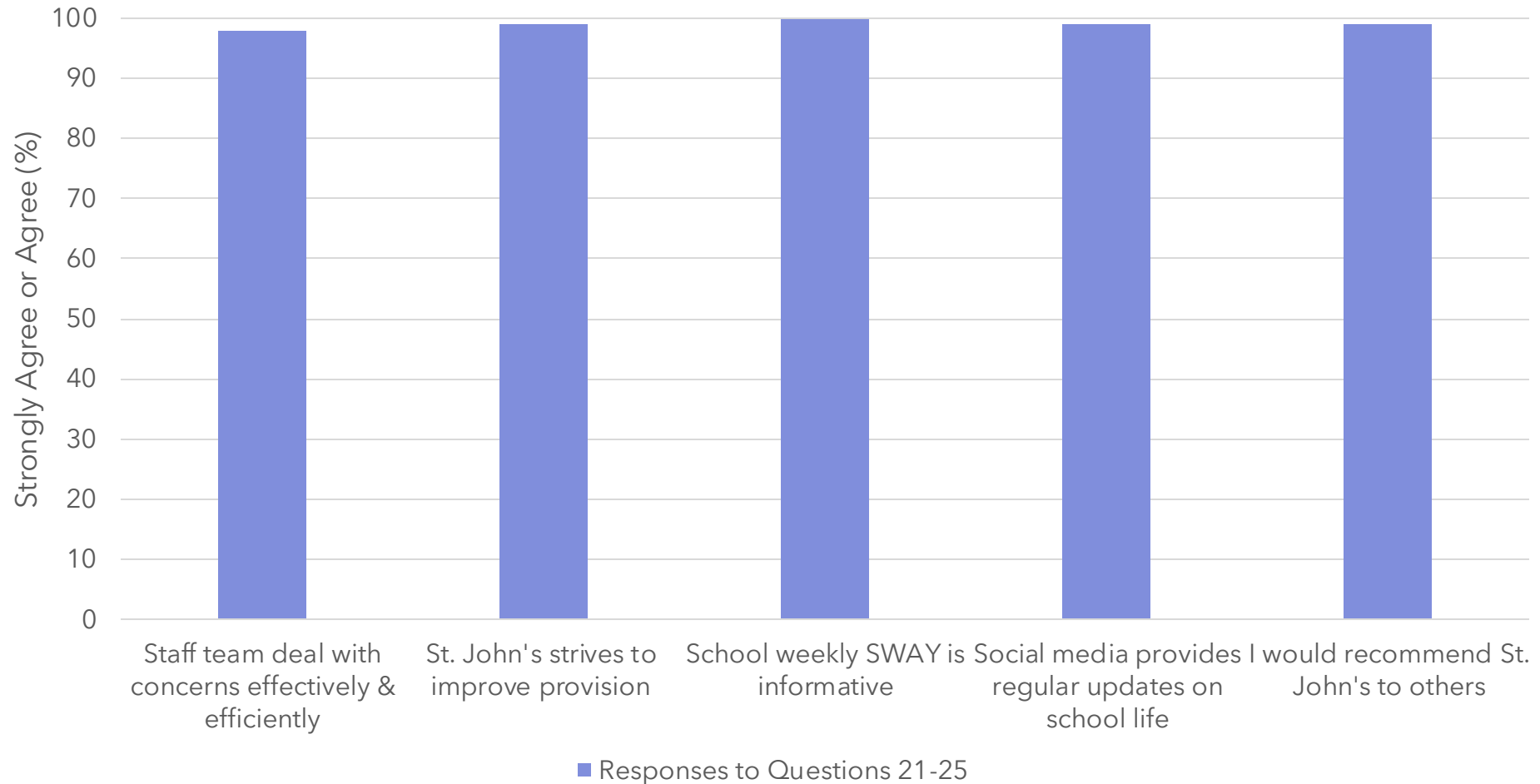
Responses to Questions 11-15
